

## STREETS AND ROADS LOCAL LAW

### CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO A PERMIT FOR AN OUTDOOR EATING AREA

1. The permit-holder must ensure that the furniture is placed:
  - (a) As close to the kerb as practicable allowing 1 metre between the kerb and the furniture at all times; **(see attached diagram)**
  - (b) Not less than 1.5 metres from any other street furniture/advertising board or display of goods;
  - (c) Not to create a danger or nuisance to the public;
  - (d) Not to occupy more than 750mm of the pavement;Unless the applicant for a permit obtains the prior written consent of Council.

2. The permit holder must ensure that:
  - (a) Pedestrians have clear access at all times to the entrance to the premises;
  - (b) No chair is placed between the kerb and any table;
  - (c) 1.8 metres of clear footpath from the façade is maintained at all times;
  - (d) The furniture is only placed in front of the applicants premises;
  - (e) All furniture is of sturdy construction and shall be acceptable to the Authorised Officer;
  - (f) Unless the applicant holds a restaurant licence or the like and the footpath area is authorised under the Liquor Control Reform Act 1998, no liquor is provided to a person occupying, using or taking advantage of the furniture.

The maximum number of tables and chairs allowed under this permit is one (1) table and four (4) chairs per 4 metres of the applicant's frontage. Where there is advertising sign and/or display of goods as well as street furniture, then only one (1) item per 4 metres of frontage will be allowed.

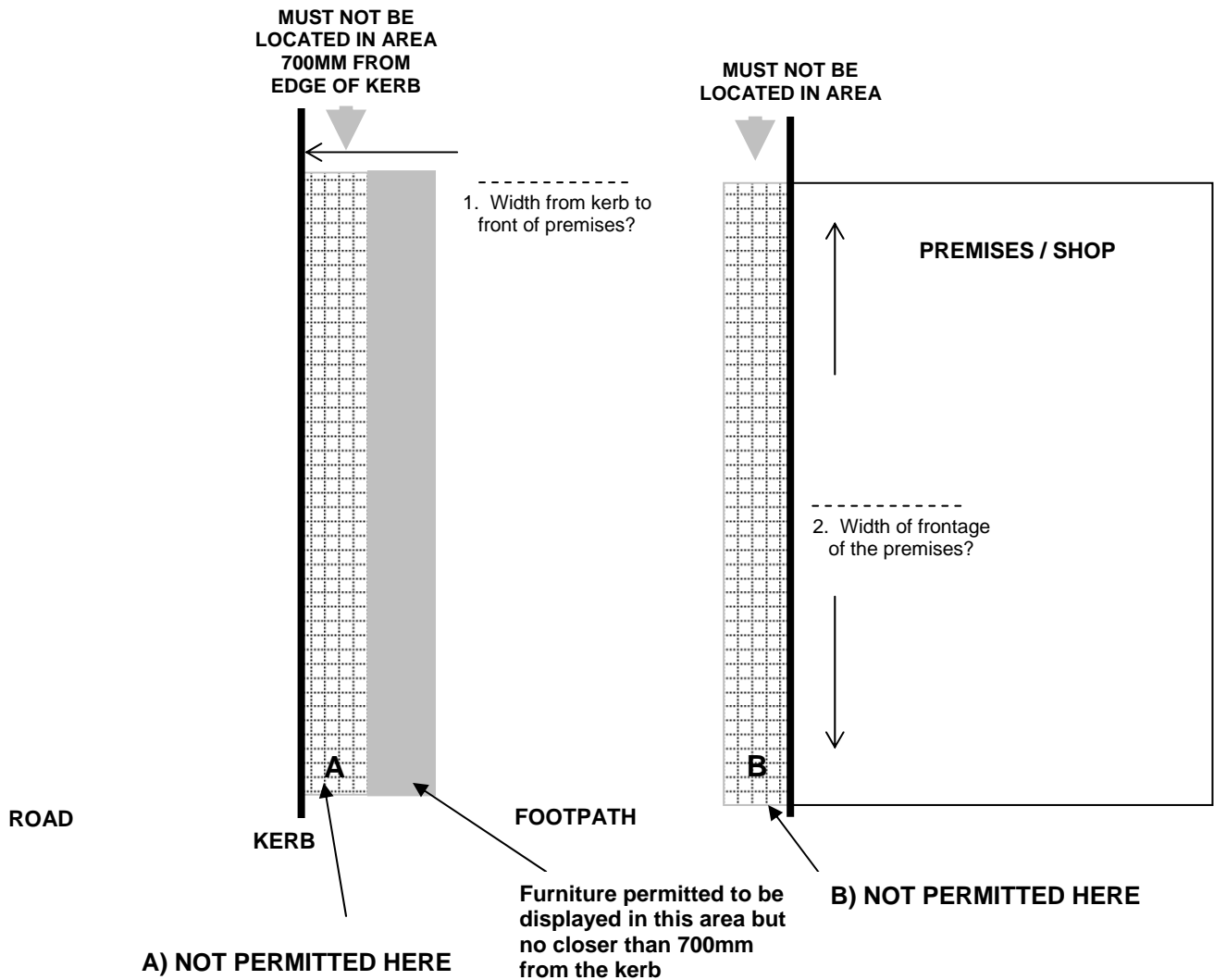
3. The permit holder must be indemnified against any liability arising out of the authorised activity, the permit holder shall effect and keep effected a Public Liability Policy of Insurance, for an amount of Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) and must produce to Council a certificate of currency for the permitted activity for the insured period annually.
4. Special conditions (if applicable).
